

Landscape Restoration Grants: Overall purpose

To fund projects that will:

- Restore ecosystem processes
- Bring nature back to degraded landscapes
- Revitalise local economies
- Provide inspiration
- Share lessons
- Long-term vision and commitment
- Deliver on the ground IMPACT

"Advocacy and education activites can be included in projects and can be vital for scaling up restoration. However, there must also be significant delivery of restoration on the ground alongside policy work"



Landscape Restoration Grants: Key features

- Competitive process
- 3 stages
- Grants from \$1.5 M to \$5 M
- 60% threshold
- Up to 5 years

Last call 75 EOI, 8 funded

Usual grant 3.5M or up. Must show have managed grant at least 60% of size asked.


Do not discourage smaller grants if idea is good

Landscape restoration focused. may have 'flagship' species but species oriented projects not eligible. Includes freshwater habitats.









Landscape Restoration Grants: Key features

- Large Scale
- Established Partnerships
- Lead organisations must:
 - > Be not for profit and non-governmental;
 - Have prior experience with similar large projects;
 - > Be active or recently active in the landscape;
 - ➤ Have managed a grant of 60% of the value requested.

Prefer active restoration partnerships with track record



Landscape Restoration Grants: Key Criteria

Scale

Don't ask for co-funding, but are interested in how good you are at getting money from other sources for the wider restoration outside ELP

Importance

Maximum 2 projects in one country at one time

Strategy

(currently none in Norway or Sweden)

Partnership

Ask for reference letters from previous contacts

- Stakeholder engagement
- Replicability
- Feasibility & Sustainability

"Primary focus delivery of restoration, but monitoring is a requirement"

> Scale and ambition

10s of thousands of ha Contiguous

Natural processes and agricultural landscapes Will support building corridors

> Lead partner

Must be real NGO

> Stand alone research

Not allowed, but applied work (monitoring etc) is

Budget

➤ 60% threshold

Meaning must have managed a project 60% the size

- Overheads
- ➤ Co-finance

Not required, but like to see project part of bigger **effort**
